Producer Kerry Robins said the process was all "part and parcel" of making it look good on release day.

Garage Sale was written by former Kapiti resident Nick Ward. The script was based on the relationship between his mother and sister. "It's in a raw state, it seems to work very well, makes people laugh at the right places and cry at the right places."
